
- Ensure start-ups access supercomputing capacity: Al Factories initiative

Apply Al Strategy

Based on the President's Political Guidelines 2024-2029 and the Draghi Report

"We will also develop with Member States, industry and civil society an **Apply AI Strategy to boost new** industrial uses of AI and to improve the delivery of a variety of public services."

Objective: delivering an overarching plan to:

- 1. further support the development of world class AI models in the EU and
- 2. foster the integration of AI technologies into EU's most strategic sectors with the aim of
- 3. unlocking the potential of innovation (i.e. Al adoption) and enabling European companies to be global front-runners.





Al Act provides legal certainty and is innovation friendly

UNACCEPTABLE RISK

Social scoring, facial recognition, dark pattern AI, manipulation



First regulation on artificial intelligence

HIGH RISK

Transportation systems, safety, employment, education access, border control, justice systems



Risk-based approach

LIMITED RISK

Al systems with specific transparency requirements such as chatbots, emotion recognition systems



Entered into force 1 August 2024

MINIMAL RISK

Al enabled videogames, spam filters

Al Regulatory Sandboxes in the EU Al Act and Al Board

- The Al Act lays down a **common framework** for the establishment and operation of Al regulatory sandboxes as a measure in **support of innovation**.
- The AI Act requires Member States and their national competent authorities to establish at least one AI regulatory sandbox on a national level that must be operational by 2 August 2026.
- The AI Board has decided to establish a sub-group to **address specific issues** related to sandboxes (such as coordination and support in their establishment and uniform operation).
- Main objective of the first meeting is to kickstart the work on AI regulatory sandboxes.
- Commission also to adopt implementing acts with common rules for the establishment and operation of sandboxes across Member States and joint sandboxes at EU level.






EU-level Coordination and Support Action (CSA)

- **Objective**: support EU Member States and National Competent Authorities in establishing and operating the AI Regulatory Sandboxes, as mandate by the AI Act by August 2026, as well as coordinate their work
- Time: 2 years
- 1. Common guidelines, frameworks, processes, and tools for NCAs to establish, operate, and the sandboxes
- 2. Technical and legal support as well as training for NCAs
- **3. Pilots** and practical testing of the output of this action
- **4. Analysis** of the accumulated experience in the sandboxes with recommendation
- 5. Publishing of all material and tools on the single digital platform






Al ecosystem
